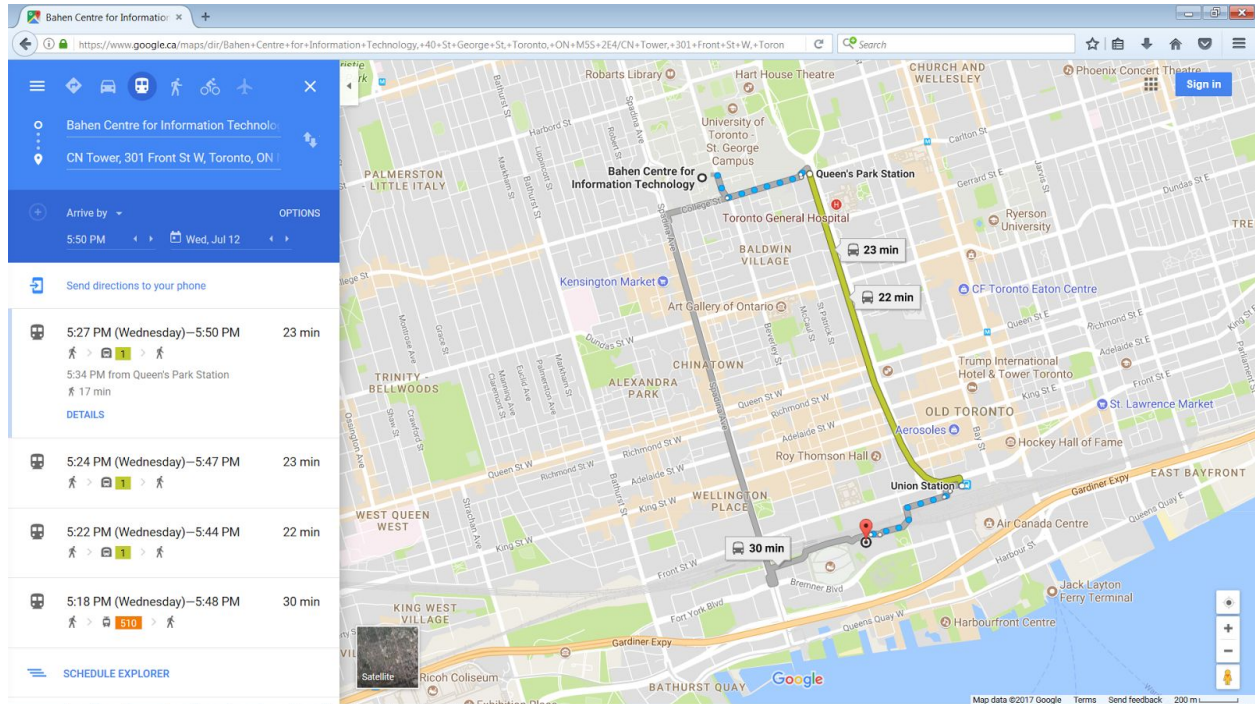

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## Correction to prices and breakfast for Sheraton

Before the Cutoff date of June 9: Thanks to Jens Maurer for asking:

“The single rate is 199 CAD per night plus tax even though N4636 says it's 226 CAD, but there's no indication that breakfast would be included, although N4636 claims it is.”

After confirming with Sheraton, breakfast is not included, although at the reduced rate of 199 CAD, the extra \$27 CAD can be used for breakfast locally, but i doubt you will need that much.

LATE BOOKING: While you can still book, the rate has jumped to over \$300 and that cannot be changed due to Indy event that week.

## Landing at Toronto Island Airport instead of YYZ

Finally, I mention in detail in N4636 how to get into Toronto from YYZ International Airport, but not from Toronto Island Airport as I have no experience there. Here is Additional info for landing at the Toronto Island airport.

Porter and some Air Canada flights, especially from the North east, land at Billy Bishop Airport, both of which are good. Location is very close to downtown hotels and offices and lots of taxis and TTC 509 and 511 to get you from airport to wherever. Porter is no frills service but relatively cheap and frequent.

### WALK THROUGH THE PEDESTRIAN TUNNEL

On July 30, 2015, Billy Bishop Airport opened a pedestrian tunnel that connects Toronto's mainland to the airport. From the mainland pavilion to the island atrium, the tunnel spans 853-feet and takes under six minutes to complete the journey to the airport check-in area.

Featuring four moving walkways and one of the longest escalator systems in Canada, the tunnel provides quick, reliable and easy access to the airport.

Access to the pedestrian tunnel is free. The mainland entrance is located next to the airport ferry terminal. For more information, view the [Take the Pedestrian Tunnel](#) page.

#### TAKE THE FERRY

Take one of the world's shortest ferry rides (121 metres) to and from the foot of Bathurst. There's a ferry every 15 minutes.

The ferry is free for pedestrians and \$11 for vehicles (round trip).

#### JUMP ON THE SHUTTLE

There's a complimentary express shuttle bus to and from Billy Bishop approximately every 15 minutes . The shuttle is open to anyone going to the airport, whether or not they are travelling.

#### RIDE A BIKE

An urban airport needs to be accessible and Billy Bishop Airport is just that. With one of Toronto's 80 BIXI stations located at the top of Eireann Quay you're a quick pedal away from the airport's doorstep.

You can also hop on your own bike and lock it up on the island or the mainland. Bike lockup is located adjacent to the ferry terminals.

#### HOP ON PUBLIC TRANSIT

Billy Bishop Airport is easily accessible by public transit. With frequent TTC service, you'll be dropped a short walk from our ferry terminal building.

Thinking of taking public transit? You can hop on the 511 Bathurst streetcar or the 509 Harbourfront.

#### GRAB A TAXI

If you're flying into Toronto and want a taxi, you will find them located at the taxi stand on the mainland, just outside the ferry terminal.

## CAR RENTALS

Rent a car right at the airport. You can find car rental counters on the island and mainland.

You may have heard that TTC now has a payment card system called presto which can be refilled like in many European cities and enables you to just wave it and pass through

In reality, though I have not used it I am told by others (so this is hearsay opinion at best) that its implementation is less than optimal as many stations only have 1 entrance with this capability, and it is often broken, so you have to line up anyway and pay. For the week you are here, public transportation using a stack of tokens or a week pass may be best. So your mileage may vary.
